    REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS had at the meeting before



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CHATRMAN WASHINGTON: Evening, Ladies and Gentlemen. I'd like to invite you -- we call the meeting of the Calumet Township Board of Trustees to order on January 2nd, 2018. May we stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.
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(Pledge of Allegiance recited.) CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: May we have a roll call, Ms. Bonds.

MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay.

MR. LAY: Here.

MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus
(No response.)
MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington.
CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Here.

There are two board members present and one absent. We have enough form a quorum.

We would like to call the reorganization of the Township Board based on Indiana Code 36-6-6-7, election of the chairman and the secretary of the Calumet Township Board for the fiscal year of 2018. At this time $I$ would like to make a motion to nominate Attorney Clorius Lay to be chairman.

MR. LAY: A second is not necessary. If I don't refuse it, it's not a matter of a second.
CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Roll call, Miss Bonds.
MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay.
MR. LAY: Yes.
MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington.
CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Yes.
With two yes, one absent, congratulations, Attorney Inay. Would you like to sit here, or would you like to chair from there?
CHAIRMAN LAY: Doesn't matter. I can sit here.
MR. WASHINGTON: Okay.
CHAIRMAN LAY: The next item on the agenda would be the election of the secretary for the board. Is there any nominations?
MR. WASHINGTON: I nominate Miss
Canty-Reedus.
CHATRMAN LAY: Second, since she's not here. It has been properly moved and seconded. Are there any other nominations?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN LAY: Are there any other nominations?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN LAY: Are there any other
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nominations?
            (No response.)
    CHAIRMAN LAY: Hearing none, seeing none,
nominations are closed. Roll call.
    MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay.
    CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes.
    MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington.
    MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.
    CHAIRMAN LAY: By a vote of two to
nothing, Miss Reedus is again secretary of the
board. I believe she also acquired the
position last year using the same system, her
absence.
    Okay. The next item on the agenda is the
approval of the minutes of October the 23rd,
2017. Do I have a motion?
    MR. WASHINGTON: Yes, you have a motion.
I make a motion that we approve the minutes
from October 23rd, 2017.
    CHAIRMAN LAY: Second.
    Is there any unreadiness concerning the
minutes as they were mailed?
    (No response.)
    CHAIRMAN LAY: Do you have any?
    MR. WASHINGTON: No, sir.
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CHAIRMAN LAY: Other than just some minor errors that may have been how I speak, I have no real changes. I don't think anything of any substance was changed. Roll call.
MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay.
CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes.
MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington.
MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.
CHAIRMAN LAY: By a vote of two to nothing, the minutes are approved as mailed of October the $23 \mathrm{rd}, 2017$.
Item No. 4, Amendment to the Resolution No. 2017-06, Standards of Eligibility of the Township Assistance. Do I have a motion to approve?
MR. WASHINGTON: Yes, sir. So move.
CHAIRMAN LAY: I second. Madame Trustee, would someone --
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Yes. What it is, is that we have received information from the ITA in attending the conference in that we can make changes to the amounts that families receive for burial assistance. It had come to us by way of some of the service providers, i.e., funeral directors here in the area, asking
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could we go up with the amounts that were --
had been set in the standards.
    And we had a meeting with them last week
and agreed that we could take each amount,
which was }1700\mathrm{ for a regular burial, and take
it to 2700, oversize $2,000 to $3,000, and
cremation went from $900 to 1200. And the
amount of the thousand dollars was the amount
that usually the family is able to provide, but
nowhere else in this state are families able to
provide additional funds because if it is,
indeed, a burial for an indigent person, there
should be nothing -- or no contribution
received from the families.
    And the second item was that we can no
longer have a residency requirement that was
placed in the standards by the the former
administration; as in Chicago, Illinois,
residents coming over and having to be a
resident with -- within six months, ITA says
that as soon as they come for service, they are
a client that has to -- that we have to serve
here. So we can no longer have a residency
requirement.
    So those are the two changes that were
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approved when we did this in October that we've had to ask for your approval so that the standards would be true and accurate.

CHAIRMAN LAY: Do you have any questions, Mr. Washington?

MR. WASHINGTON: No, just a statement. And Madame Trustee, if you want to elaborate, I understand, but also reading that -- I was kind of concerned about that because a lot of people come over, take the benefits, and then leave. And I think there are several stipulations in the guidelines: They have to prove, first, before they come here --

TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Yes.
MR. WASHINGTON: -- and get assistance.
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Yes, yes. The only thing that was pretty much our issue was that they would have an ID. And if it did not say Indiana, that's how we knew; or if it was Indiana, their last address could be Hammond or East Chicago, which would send them to another area of service.

But if they say to us, I now live in the city of Gary, I haven't had any -- or Griffith or Cal Township, I haven't had anything change,

responsibility, even though Cal Township residents believe that it's the trustee's responsibilities for ambulance service. Since the former trustee disbanded the services, we


 just didn't have any, and it's not our responsibility. Just like they call the county police for that area, they call the county with this whole 911 consolidation system. So that's where we were, I thought, with it.This organization -- what is it called -Elite Services came, I guess, and spoke with Commissioner Repay, because after Superior asked to continue the contract, I think they were just like almost $\$ 600,000$ too much in what they were asking of the county. So these people came in with their contract. And the next thing I know, I read about it in the paper, I got a call from a news reporter asking about what were we doing. And, you know, they had already made the decision, as in the commissioners. And so I did tell them, you know, if you were going to involve us in it, we should have known something.
CHAIRMAN LAY: Right.
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: And so they were like,
well, we'll sign it now. Because I said, I haven't spoken with my board. I won't speak with my board. I'm not going to call an emergency meeting on this because it's not our emergency.

And they were like, well, we're going to sign this with them because we need some coverage. So if that's their way of dealing with it, that's fine. We don't have anything to do with it. They just threw us in because, again, people believe Cal Township should serve as their fire protection agency, and we have no responsibility to that. And Gary had no problem. They don't get that many runs. Gary had no problem with continuing to help us because they're there. Nor did Merrillville, because it's like just a small area. And so the Lake Ridge Department was the one that's making the big brouhoo [sic], as they have a new fire station that they have not even moved into yet.

So it's all kind of stuff going on there that's like they're trying to put us in the middle, but $I$ know you asked for a copy of the contract. Commission Allen sent it here. So I
just made a copy for everyone, and that was it. MR. WASHINGTON: Again, Mr. Chairman, when I got the letter, I called our commissioner, and he kind of gave me a background. So then $I$ told him, you know, make sure he followed up with the trustee and that she would, you know, do what was necessary.
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: And Commissioner Allen is our commissioner personally, but, you know, it's Repay for the Calumet Township area. So the two of them, I believe, worked on that together.
MR. WASHINGTON: Uh-huh.
CHAIRMAN LAY: So I would assume it's your position to do nothing?
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: If you guys want to
sign it --
CHATRMAN LAY: No. Your position.
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: My position is it's fine. You know, let them be responsible or have their responsibilities.
CHAIRMAN LAY: Okay. But your position --
TRUSTEE ROBINSON: I'm not going to sign it.
CHAIRMAN LAY: Just they don't know that
