1 CHAIRMAN LAY: Good afternoon. Welcome
2 to the meeting. As a matter of fact, this
3 is the most people I've seen in a long time,
4 appears to be from the outside.

5 Pledge of Allegiance.

6 (EVERYONE STOOD FOR THE PLEDGE OF
7 ALLEGIANCE.)

8 CHAIRMAN LAY: Roll call.

9 MS. BONDS: Mr. Darren Washington?

10 MR. WASHINGTON: Present.

11 MS. BONDS: Ms. Mary Ann Canty-Reedus?

12 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Present.

13 MS. BONDS: Mr. Clorius Lay?

14 CHAIRMAN LAY: Present. Three present,
15 which is a sufficient number to do business
16 for the township.

17 The first item on the agenda is
18 approval -- strike that.

19 Is there any need to amend this agenda
20 in any way?

21 (NO RESPONSE.)

22 CHAIRMAN LAY: Hearing none, seeing
23 none.

24 The first item on the agenda is approval
25 of the minutes of September 17, 2018.

1 MR. WASHINGTON: Mr. Chairman, I make a
2 motion to approve the minutes of September
3 17, 2018.

4 MS. MONROE: I affirm.

5 CHAIRMAN LAY: Moved and properly
6 seconded. Roll call.

7 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

8 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.

9 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

10 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

11 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

12 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. A vote of three to
13 nothing. Minutes are approved as we see.

14 Item No. 3, Resolution 2018-03, 2019
15 operating budget.

16 Madam Trustee.

17 MS. ROBINSON: We will refer to
18 Mr. Dalton.

19 MR. DALTON: Good evening, board
20 members.

21 You'll recall one month ago on
22 September 17th we met in the same room for
23 the public hearing portion of the budget.
24 The budget in front of you has not been
25 changed. Not a single number has been

1 changed on it since that public hearing.
2 This evening was the advertised date for the
3 adoption at your will, to adopt or not
4 adopt.

5 I'll entertain questions. There were
6 not that many questions at the public
7 hearing, but as you've had a chance to
8 review, perhaps you've brought up some other
9 questions you'd like to address prior to
10 voting.

11 CHAIRMAN LAY: Do you have any
12 questions, Ms. Reedus?

13 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: No.

14 CHAIRMAN LAY: Do you have any
15 questions, Mr. Washington?

16 MR. WASHINGTON: No, Mr. Chairman.

17 CHAIRMAN LAY: I have none.

18 Does anyone in the public have any
19 questions? You certainly can ask if you do.

20 Seeing none, hearing none. Roll call.

21 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

22 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.

23 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

24 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

25 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

1 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Three yeses, no
2 nos. Budget has -- Resolution 2018 has
3 passed.

4 The next item on the agenda is 2018-04.
5 Mr. Dalton.

6 MR. DALTON: A very similar preamble.
7 This is the exact same document that you
8 looked at one month ago. There's been no
9 changes made to this resolution. You'll
10 recall each year we're required to pass --
11 you are required to pass a salary
12 resolution, which is enforced starting on
13 January 1st, 2019, and lasting until the
14 next year. The only time a salary therefore
15 can be changed during the year of 2019 would
16 be come to you for an amendment of said
17 resolution.

18 CHAIRMAN LAY: Are there any questions,
19 Mr. Washington?

20 MR. WASHINGTON: No, sir.

21 CHAIRMAN LAY: Ms. Reedus?

22 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: No, sir.

23 CHAIRMAN LAY: Mr. -- I noticed
24 Mr. Piggy is in the audience. Do you have
25 any questions concerning the budget?

1 MR. PIGGY: No. I'm just looking to try
2 to get a handle on stuff.

3 CHAIRMAN LAY: No questions?

4 MR. PIGGY: No questions.

5 CHAIRMAN LAY: I have no questions.

6 Roll call.

7 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

8 MR. WASHINGTON: No.

9 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

10 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

11 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

12 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Two yeses, one no.

13 Salary resolution budget is passed for 2019.

14 The next item on the agenda is No. 5.

15 Resolution 2018-05, standards of eligibility
16 of the township assistance.

17 MS. ROBINSON: Mr. Chair, what you have
18 before you is the annual standards of
19 eligibility that we must submit every year
20 for your perusal or acceptance, and there
21 is -- there were a few changes made but just
22 like grammatical errors that had been there
23 and some timelines. And one rule that we
24 had to redo, not accepting anyone who is not
25 a part of the township -- well, someone

1 without living here within the last 60 days,
2 or so. And ITA said that we cannot refuse
3 anyone because of residence. Once they come
4 to your township, they are an immediate
5 resident and you have to service them.

6 CHAIRMAN LAY: What does Attorney
7 Williams say about that?

8 MR. WILLIAMS: The statute is silent as
9 to residency. I've read what the Trustee
10 has provided me, and I have no reason to
11 challenge the decision of the organization.

12 CHAIRMAN LAY: But it's not in the
13 statute?

14 MR. WILLIAMS: No.

15 CHAIRMAN LAY: I didn't recall that
16 either.

17 MR. WILLIAMS: It's silent in the
18 statute. It just says, "residency."

19 MS. ROBINSON: That was in place when we
20 got here, and we had always questioned it.
21 And we had some clients, as well, question
22 it. So we took it out, and there's no
23 longer an issue of residency. You come in.
24 You ask for services.

25 CHAIRMAN LAY: So you just walk in and

1 you can receive services?

2 MS. ROBINSON: Yes, sir. If your
3 license says you're from Illinois or some
4 other township, we have to get you going if
5 you are now a resident of Calumet Township.

6 CHAIRMAN LAY: I'm sorry. I
7 misunderstood. I don't want to waste too
8 much time. I thought you said if they're
9 not residents of the township.

10 MS. ROBINSON: No.

11 MR. WILLIAMS: If I may. Well, it
12 was -- the previous rule gave a statutory
13 limit of time in which you had to be a
14 resident. They said that in itself was
15 against -- I don't want to say the law. The
16 statute is silent to it. It just says you
17 have to be a resident. They said that the
18 arbitrary period in time in which you had to
19 be a resident, they took objection to. That
20 was the portion that we eliminated from the
21 old standards. And now it's just simply a
22 resident.

23 CHAIRMAN LAY: So you're satisfied with
24 that?

25 MS. ROBINSON: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN LAY: I have no further
2 questions. Anyone else have any questions
3 in that area?

4 MR. WASHINGTON: Mr. Chairman?

5 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes.

6 MR. WASHINGTON: Is this something that
7 we need to maybe look at changing the law to
8 make it specific to Calumet Township?
9 Because with limited funds, you know how
10 people dabble and dabble and go across --
11 back and forth across lines. And I think
12 it's kind of unfair we're mandated to pay
13 for services for people who really don't
14 live here.

15 Do you think that's something,
16 Counselor, that we may need to pursue from
17 the Indiana Code aspect?

18 CHAIRMAN LAY: Well, I don't know if
19 they need to go that far. I would assume we
20 could pass a motion to that effect if that's
21 what you wanted to put in there. In other
22 words, if the attorney says it's not in the
23 law. I'm not a member of ITA. Never been
24 to a meeting of ITA. ITA does not appear to
25 be attorneys, just township trustees, so I'm

1 not really sure --

2 MR. WILLIAMS: Well, they have a legal
3 division, in which we've consulted with it
4 and been advised on issues in the before
5 this board. The requirement of being a
6 resident is within the statute. The only
7 thing we're limiting is the time period. So
8 we wouldn't necessarily be giving assistance
9 to individuals who can't establish
10 residency. We simply eliminated the
11 arbitrary period in which they had to have
12 been a resident, so I believe the change
13 that has made is appropriate.

14 MR. WASHINGTON: Okay.

15 CHAIRMAN LAY: Anyone said that this
16 township didn't have an attorney, but of
17 course that is not true. No, that came from
18 ITA.

19 All right. Since we have no motion on
20 the floor to that effect -- Mr. Piggy, what
21 was your question?

22 MR. PIGGY: My question was this,
23 Mr. Chair: What would that person be
24 entitled to if they just moved here six
25 months ago?

1 CHAIRMAN LAY: Oh, they'd be entitled to
2 everything.

3 MR. PIGGY: Everything?

4 CHAIRMAN LAY: As I understand it, they
5 can move here for 6 hours or 60 minutes, and
6 they would be entitled. Correct?

7 MR. WILLIAMS: Correct.

8 MR. PIGGY: They would be entitled to
9 everything?

10 CHAIRMAN LAY: Absolutely.

11 Roll call on the approval of Resolution
12 2018-05.

13 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

14 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.

15 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

16 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

17 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

18 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Three yeses, no
19 nos. Eligibility of township assistance
20 for, I guess it would be 2019, approved.

21 The next item is the holiday schedule
22 for 2019, 2018-06.

23 MR. WASHINGTON: Mr. Chairman, I make a
24 motion to approve Resolution No. 2018-06,
25 the 2019 holiday schedule.

1 CHAIRMAN LAY: Do we have a second?

2 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN LAY: Properly moved and
4 seconded. Roll call.

5 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

6 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.

7 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

8 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

9 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

10 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Three yeses, no
11 nos. Resolution 2018-06 for the 2019
12 holiday is approved.

13 The next item on the agenda is the
14 Amendment to Resolution 2017-07, the 2018
15 holiday schedule.

16 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: I thought we just did
17 that.

18 MS. BONDS: No.

19 CHAIRMAN LAY: Madam Trustee is going to
20 explain.

21 MS. ROBINSON: What happened was it was
22 the 2017-18 that we're working in now did
23 not have New Year's Eve, so we had to amend
24 that before we -- well, we did the new one
25 for '19, and we had -- we just wanted to

1 amend that. And it also -- the other one --
2 the initial one, you had Mr. Washington
3 named as Chairman. And Mr. Lay is Chairman.

4 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes, he's the boss, and
5 we want to make sure he knows that.

6 CHAIRMAN LAY: Okay. Roll call.

7 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

8 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.

9 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?

10 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.

11 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?

12 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Three yeses, no
13 nos. Resolution 2017-07 has been approved.

14 Resolution No. 2018-07, temporary loan
15 extension. Madam Trustee?

16 MS. ROBINSON: I would defer to Steve
17 Dalton.

18 MR. DALTON: Board members, if you'll
19 recall, at least for the last four years,
20 instead of borrowing money from a bank for
21 cash flow purposes, we've borrowed money
22 from ourselves, from our Rainy Day Fund. We
23 do so early in the year. The statute
24 requires that we pay each of those loans
25 back by December 31st. Because of the

1 lateness of the arrival of our tax draw,
2 that's not always possible. So this
3 resolution covers your accounting department
4 so that they can wait until after the first
5 of the year to repay those Rainy Day loans.

6 They have, officially, according to the
7 statute, until June 30th of 2019, to repay
8 those Rainy Day loans. Obviously, we'll be
9 coming to you early in the spring to make
10 the new Rainy Day loans.

11 I will be happy to report to you that
12 those will be lesser. We have actually
13 begun to build up some cash reserve so that
14 we don't need to borrow as much. So the
15 2019 balance that's going to be borrowed
16 from ourselves will be lesser than this
17 amount now that you're extending across the
18 date line.

19 CHAIRMAN LAY: Any questions,
20 Mr. Washington?

21 MR. WASHINGTON: Nope.

22 CHAIRMAN LAY: Ms. Reedus?

23 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: No.

24 CHAIRMAN LAY: Ms. Reedus?

25 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: No.

1 CHAIRMAN LAY: You know if you were in
2 the Gary City Court, Judge Monroe would take
3 your phone. I'm not going to do that.
4 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: I appreciate that
5 very much. I thought I had it off. Please
6 excuse me.
7 CHAIRMAN LAY: Roll call.
8 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?
9 MR. WASHINGTON: Yes.
10 MS. BONDS: Ms. Reedus?
11 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Yes.
12 MS. BONDS: Mr. Lay?
13 CHAIRMAN LAY: Yes. Three yeses, no
14 nos, temporary loan extension 2018-07 has
15 been approved.
16 We're now open to public comments.
17 Anyone from the public that is here to
18 speak, you have a statutory right to do
19 that. Mr. Piggy, let me hold you to the
20 end. I'm going to commit you to speak with
21 the board.
22 Does anyone have any questions from the
23 public? Anyone have any questions in the
24 public? Hearing none, seeing none, public
25 portion is now closed.

1 Madam Trustee?

2 MS. ROBINSON: We're just trying to hold
3 back the tears because I know this is our
4 last meeting, our official meeting.

5 (INAUDIBLE CHATTER.)

6 MS. ROBINSON: But no, I do really just
7 want to say to Ms. Mary Ann Canty-Reedus and
8 Mr. Clorius, Attorney Lay, two people that
9 I've known for all of my life, all of my
10 whole 50 years, and I just want to say thank
11 you for your service. I'm sorry we didn't
12 have better results, but you know, our doors
13 are always open. So if you just want to
14 come down and see us, visit, volunteer, any
15 of the above, we're always here for you.
16 And I wish you well in all of your future
17 endeavors as a Trustee.

18 CHAIRMAN LAY: Okay. Now board
19 comments. Mr. Piggy, why don't you go
20 first.

21 MR. PIGGY: Mr. Chair, I have a concern
22 with the gentleman who talked about in terms
23 of loans. Now, is that -- those loans, are
24 they every year? Are they frequent loans?
25 Are they something that -- emergency loans

1 or what?

2 MR. DALTON: Mr. Chair, do you want me
3 to respond to the question?

4 CHAIRMAN LAY: Of course.

5 MR. DALTON: Mr. Piggy, when the Trustee
6 took over this township's administration,
7 there was a substantial structural imbalance
8 in the budget. We were spending more than
9 we were bringing in, and that is not easy to
10 correct overnight. So over the last four
11 years with expense allocations and cuts and
12 staff cuts, the expenditures now much more
13 closely align with the revenues. In almost
14 every single case the funds are now
15 structurally balanced.

16 But because of the draw-down of the
17 reserves over the years prior to this
18 administration, there are frequent times
19 during the year where there is enough money
20 when we're not waiting for the tax draw. We
21 only get the tax draw in June and December.
22 In between those periods of time when cash
23 drops really low, we can either borrow from
24 a bank for cash flow purposes or we can
25 borrow from ourselves, from the Rainy Day

1 Fund, and save the interest.

2 We've been for the last four years
3 borrowing from ourselves, not paying any
4 interest. We borrow it in February. We're
5 supposed to pay it back in December, but
6 because of the touchiness of when we get the
7 tax draw, we give ourselves this emergency
8 opportunity to pay it just after the
9 dateline in the new year. And then the next
10 spring we take new loans to get to June
11 again. Each time we've been borrowing a
12 little bit less from ourselves as we get
13 back to structurally balanced.

14 MR. PIGGY: One other question. Is that
15 a large amount of money or just, you know, a
16 few thousand?

17 MR. DALTON: In 2018 we borrowed
18 1.57 million dollars from the Rainy Day Fund
19 into three funds: The Township Assistance
20 Fund, the Civil -- Township Civil Fund and
21 the Township Recreation Fund, so into three
22 funds. Those three funds, as we did cash
23 flow projections, were going to dip down too
24 low before June and, again, too low before
25 December, so we borrowed money to make sure

1 that we had cash flow to pay payroll and to
2 pay out township assistance during the year.

3 MR. PIGGY: You answered my question.

4 MR. DALTON: Thank you.

5 CHAIRMAN LAY: Ms. Reedus, board
6 comments from you?

7 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: Oh, yes. First of
8 all, I want to talk about the meeting that
9 the trustee and deputy and three of our
10 employees and myself went down to a
11 conference in September, and it was very
12 informative. It was the Indiana Township
13 Association Conference in Indianapolis. And
14 last year I was certified in intake, and
15 this year I was certified in public
16 relations. And in both of those meetings I
17 found out that they were hand in hand, in
18 that if you were doing intake and as the
19 clients come in and, of course, instead of
20 doing the intake, the public relations, the
21 way you present yourself to the client, has
22 a lot to do with the overall steady process
23 of the township itself. So if you were
24 portraying yourself as an employee, it also
25 helps the overall complex or the way people

1 see the township itself.

2 The other employees were also certified
3 in the area in which they were. We had a
4 very nice time. We were on target as far as
5 going to our meetings and doing what we were
6 supposed to do, and I want to thank the
7 Trustee for letting me do that. They had a
8 banquet, and they had a township portion --
9 well, the township had a -- they chose a
10 township of the year, and they chose a
11 trustee of the year, and our own Trustee was
12 chosen. 2017 or 16?

13 MS. SMITH: 16.

14 MS. CANTY-REEDUS: 2016. Okay. And I
15 want to thank everyone for my four wonderful
16 years on the board, and thank you for your
17 kindness to me and made me do all the
18 talking, whatever I do, and coming up with
19 understanding some of the things that are
20 going on in the Trustee, and I appreciate
21 it. And also to my colleagues, thank you
22 very much.

23 BOARD MEMBERS: You're welcome.

24 CHAIRMAN LAY: Okay. Is there anything
25 else? Then we'll --

1 MR. WASHINGTON: Wait a minute.

2 CHAIRMAN LAY: Oh, I'm sorry. I didn't
3 mean to cut you off. I got confused when I
4 let Mr. Piggy speak.

5 MR. WASHINGTON: No. I just wanted to
6 say that it's been a pleasure serving with
7 Mr. Lay and Ms. Canty-Reedus. I want to
8 clarify my "no" vote on the budget. It was
9 pretty much in concert with hoping that
10 since Griffith has went out and decided to
11 seek a new township, I wish them the best
12 wherever they go. But if they do actually
13 find someone to take on that burden that we
14 were doing for so many years, it frees some
15 things up. And I know it won't happen this
16 year, but I'm hoping that we can provide
17 some salary increases for some of the other
18 staff inside the entire township. Because
19 with all of the criticism that is levied
20 against Calumet Township, I don't think --
21 working as a former employee of Department
22 of Child Services, I think a lot of people
23 are miseducated on how strong and how hard
24 township employees work on a day-to-day
25 basis. And just like in corporate America,

1 people expect raises.

2 State, they just got a 12 percent raise
3 with the State. And so there should be an
4 opportunity for Calumet Township employees
5 to have raises also, not outside our
6 Trustee. She's doing well and assisted.
7 But I'm just talking about some of the
8 people that are on the grass roots that file
9 the paperwork, that do a lot of the
10 nitty-gritty work that we don't see out in
11 the community, they also deserve an
12 increase.

13 And I'm thankful for the employees
14 sticking with us because it's just been very
15 difficult with a lot of stuff going on with
16 the cessation and trying to get the State to
17 decide on what formula they actually want to
18 go by. I have to commend the Trustee and
19 the staff of meeting the 12 times as was
20 previously mandated by the State, but for
21 some reasons I think -- I'm not going to get
22 into the other reasons, but they decided to
23 switch at the last minute, which cause a
24 flux. So to Kim and to the rest of the
25 staff, I want to say a job well done and

1 bringing in Dalton to bringing us the 12
2 times average as originally we thought that
3 the legislature said. So unfortunately,
4 they decided something else, but that's
5 okay.

6 But I want to say to all of the other
7 Calumet Township employees that work hard on
8 a day-to-day basis, the board has not forgot
9 about you, and I'm hoping that we can do
10 something to reward you for the hard work
11 that you've done over the years.

12 And other than that, I want you all to
13 have a happy Thanksgiving, have a merry
14 Christmas, and continue the hard work that
15 you have continued to do for the township.
16 That's it now, Mr. Lay.

17 CHAIRMAN LAY: And again, although I did
18 speak out of order, I admit that. Madam
19 Trustee, you may call it to order. We're
20 adjourned. Thank you.

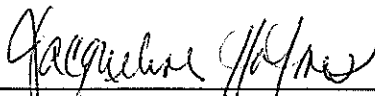

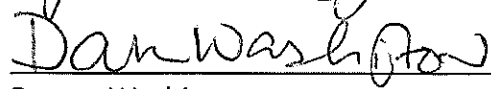
