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1 (BOARD MEETING COMMENCED AT 6:08 PM.)

2 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Good evening  
3 ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the  
4 township board meeting for this evening.  
5 Can we please stand for the Pledge of  
6 Allegiance.

7 (PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.)

8 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Good evening,  
9 Ms. Bonds. How are you this evening?

10 MS. BONDS: Good. How are you, Chairman  
11 Washington?

12 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Doing great.

13 Can we start with a roll call?

14 MS. BONDS: Yes, sir.

15 Ms. Holmes?

16 MS. HOLMES: Present.

17 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

18 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Present.

19 MS. BONDS: Mr. Piggee?

20 MR. PIGGEE: Present.

21 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: With three board  
22 members in attendance, we have enough for a  
23 quorum. We'll go to Item No. 2, approval of  
24 the minutes for July 20th, 2020.

25 And Chair makes a motion for the

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approval --

MR. PIGGEE: So moved.

CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: -- of the minutes  
of July 20th, 2020.

Are there any questions by board members  
regarding the minutes of the meeting or  
Madame Trustee?

TRUSTEE ROBINSON: No, I don't have any.

CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Hearing none, may  
we have a roll call.

MS. BONDS: Mr. Piggee?

MR. PIGGEE: Present.

MS. BONDS: Ms. Holmes?

MS. HOLMES: Present -- no, wait.

CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: We're doing the  
approval of the minutes.

MR. PIGGEE: Yay. Yes.

MS. BONDS: Ms. Holmes?

MS. HOLMES: Yes.

MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Yes.

With three yeses, the motion carries for  
the approval of the minutes of July 20th,  
2020.

Item No. 3, Notice to Taxpayers of

1 additional appropriations.

2 Madam Trustee.

3 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Good afternoon. We  
4 will have -- defer back to our financial  
5 advisor, Mr. Dalton.

6 MR. DALTON: Good evening, everyone,  
7 board members, Trustee.

8 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Good evening.

9 MR. DALTON: Thank you.

10 Items 3 and 4 are attached at the hip,  
11 so I will tell you what Item 3 is, but it  
12 does not require an action. It is merely a  
13 copy of the advertisement that was run in  
14 the newspaper on September 1st. We're  
15 required to run such an advertisement at  
16 least 10 days prior to this meeting, which  
17 refers to Resolution '20-06.

18 With your permission, Mr. Chairman, I'll  
19 go ahead and move to Item 4 because it's the  
20 next item. The resolution asks for \$500,000  
21 to be appropriated in the line item, "Other  
22 Services and Charges out of the Rainy Day  
23 Fund."

24 I'd like the Trustee to speak to the use  
25 of these dollars because it's related to

1 this facility, if you could.

2 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Okay. Yes, I'm  
3 sorry. I wasn't paying attention. So what  
4 we are asking is what we asked of last  
5 meeting when we mentioned the different  
6 things that needed to be repaired to keep us  
7 functioning down here. Like, to date -- I  
8 was saving it for my words, but to date, the  
9 asbestos has been removed. And Bloomfield  
10 is actually just waiting for the piece of  
11 equipment that they need to replace out to  
12 come in. And all of the other things that  
13 we have repaired. Like, right now we're  
14 finding that we are having problems out at  
15 the NPC and some plumbing issues.

16 So it was just really proficient to have  
17 the money so we wouldn't have to try and  
18 call every other day to say, can we do this,  
19 can we do that? And we've used most -- not  
20 most -- not nearly most of it. But we've  
21 done most of the improvements is what I  
22 meant to say. I'm sorry.

23 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Any questions by  
24 board members?

25 Hearing none. We need to pass this

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1 resolution though, don't we?

2 MR. WILLIAMS: The public.

3 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Is there anyone  
4 tonight in the public that would like to  
5 speak on Resolution 2020-6?

6 Hearing none, the Chair makes a motion  
7 to approve Resolution 2020-6, additional  
8 appropriations. Is there a second?

9 MR. PIGGEE: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: May we have a roll  
11 call, Ms. Bonds.

12 MS. BONDS: Mr. Piggee?

13 MR. PIGGEE: Yes.

14 MS. BONDS: Ms. Holmes?

15 MS. HOLMES: Yes.

16 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

17 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Yes.

18 With three yays, the resolution passes.

19 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Thank you.

20 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Item No. 5,  
21 Resolution 2020-07, appropriations and tax  
22 rates, Budget Form 4.

23 Mr. Dalton.

24 MR. DALTON: Thank you again.

25 And again, the next two items, Items 5



1 and 6 are attached. Item 5 is the actual  
2 resolution numbered No. 7 that you will be  
3 asked to adopt at the next meeting in  
4 October. We are not allowed to hold the  
5 public hearing on the budget and adopt the  
6 budget at the same meeting. So this  
7 document will come back to you in one month  
8 for adoption.

9 The details for this document are in the  
10 second document that you have in your  
11 possession, which is 2020-08. And it also,  
12 again, shows you what notice was already run  
13 to the taxpayers. And this is the document  
14 that would be probably most known to you as  
15 the line item budget. We included each line  
16 item that we're were going to be asking you  
17 to you approve next month in the line item  
18 budget, under the Budget -- what's called  
19 Budget Form 1, budget estimate for each  
20 fund: The Rainy Day Fund, the General Fund,  
21 the Township Assistance Administration Fund,  
22 the Township Assistance Benefits Fund.

23 I will make a note that the recreation  
24 fund, which you currently use, we will be  
25 folding at the end of this year. Maybe

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1 folding is the wrong word. But we'll be  
2 eliminating that fund, and the dollars in  
3 that fund will automatically revert to the  
4 Civil Fund, the General Fund, as they're  
5 needed to by statute. There's really no  
6 reason to have a totally separate fund. It  
7 was creating a lot more effort to move both  
8 people and dollars around when they all are  
9 similarly working for the benefit of the  
10 civil township.

11 There is no request for a vote tonight,  
12 Mr. President, but there is a request that  
13 the public be required to comment.

14 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Before we go to  
15 the public, are there any board members  
16 tonight that would like to speak or ask any  
17 questions regarding Resolution 2020-07  
18 and -08?

19 MS. HOLMES: None.

20 MR. PIGGEE: None.

21 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Mr. Piggee?

22 MR. PIGGEE: None.

23 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Okay. Is there  
24 anyone in the audience this evening that has  
25 any questions or any comments regarding

1 Resolution Nos. 2020-07 or 2020-08?

2 Okay. Hearing none, we will go to Item  
3 No. 7, which is Resolution No. 2020-09.

4 MR. DALTON: I'd be happy to introduce  
5 this resolution. You see every year a  
6 similar resolution on salaries. It's  
7 required that we pass a resolution annually  
8 to stipulate to the salaries for the elected  
9 officials and the employees of the Township.  
10 I don't actually know that there were any  
11 changes made, so I'd like to ask Ms. Smith  
12 if she'd like to point out any changes  
13 because I believe it is, for the most part,  
14 the same as 2020; is that correct?

15 MS. SMITH: That is correct. I guess  
16 the only things that were changed were there  
17 were a couple of positions that were added  
18 back to it. They had previously been on  
19 previous resolutions, and they were just  
20 added on. For example, the -- there was a  
21 personnel administrator position for human  
22 resources that was on a previous resolution.  
23 When that position was no longer available,  
24 when those positions had been eliminated,  
25 that was added back. So that is the only

1 addition. Everything else -- our positions  
2 were already on here.

3 MR. PIGGEE: Mr. Chair, I have a  
4 question.

5 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Mr. Piggee.

6 MR. PIGGEE: You said something about  
7 elected officials -- you said something  
8 about elected officials' salaries. Can you  
9 explain that?

10 MR. DALTON: You and the Trustee.

11 MR. PIGGEE: So it's talking about just  
12 the Board and the Trustee?

13 MR. DALTON: Yes.

14 MR. PIGGEE: Okay. Please make that  
15 clear because I thought you was talking  
16 about all the elected officials.

17 MR. DALTON: No. Just you guys.

18 And Mr. Chairman, just to note, you can  
19 take action on this resolution. There's no  
20 requirement that we wait until October.

21 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: For the salaries.

22 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Madam Trustee, do  
23 you have anything?

24 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: No. I was just  
25 saying for the salaries. And just as the

1 other one, I wanted to say nothing had  
2 changed.

3 And I wanted to make sure, did you all  
4 get your packages in time? I know there was  
5 a request for a week out.

6 MR. PIGGEE: Yes.

7 MS. HOLMES: Yes.

8 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: And I wanted to make  
9 sure.

10 MS. HOLMES: Thank you.

11 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Thank you.

12 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Any questions from  
13 any board members regarding Resolution  
14 2020-09 -- from board members?

15 MS. HOLMES: I have none.

16 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: None.

17 Any questions from the public?

18 (NO RESPONSE.)

19 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: The Chair would  
20 like to make a motion for the approval of  
21 Resolution 2020-09. Is there a second?

22 MS. HOLMES: I'll second.

23 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Any discussions?

24 Hearing none, roll call, Ms. Bonds.

25 MS. BONDS: Mr. Piggee?

1 MR. PIGGEE: Yes.

2 MS. BONDS: Ms. Holmes?

3 MS. HOLMES: Yes.

4 MS. BONDS: Mr. Washington?

5 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Yes.

6 With three yeases and zero nos, the  
7 motion carries for Resolution 2020-09, the  
8 2021 salary budget.

9 At this time are there anybody here that  
10 would like to make public comments?

11 Hearing none.

12 Madam Trustee, good evening.

13 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Good evening. I see  
14 we have a huge crowd today. Our friends  
15 over from City Council, welcome. My council  
16 lady, Linda Caldwell -- no, Linda Barnes  
17 Caldwell, First District Councilman William  
18 Godwin, and our At-Large Councilman Mr. Ron  
19 Brewer.

20 Also, I'd like to thank all the  
21 employees who stayed over tonight for the  
22 meeting. I just want to report out that,  
23 again, most of the work that we were asking  
24 for as an improvement have been done. We're  
25 just waiting for some equipment to come in.

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1 We have turned in our reimbursement to the  
2 Lake County Auditor for all of the PPE, the  
3 maintenance, and the food and vouchers that  
4 we gave out to the tune of \$144,730.15. I  
5 don't think that's a lot. And I hear that  
6 we have lots of money to give. So let's  
7 keep our prayers and fingers crossed. We  
8 are back to regular hours.

9 Yes, Mr. Piggee.

10 MR. PIGGEE: Will you repeat the money  
11 that was spent on --

12 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: \$144,730.15.

13 MR. PIGGEE: Was that for the vouchers  
14 that you did?

15 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: That was for  
16 vouchers. That was for gift cards. That  
17 was for maintenance that included the fog  
18 and the floor. That was for all the PPE  
19 equipment that you see.

20 MR. PIGGEE: Okay.

21 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Okay?

22 MR. PIGGEE: Okay.

23 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Again, we're back to  
24 regular hours. We're back to full time,  
25 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. So if you have

1 anyone -- we stopped taking clients -- well,  
2 not stopped taking clients, but staff and I  
3 decided that it was working well as we have  
4 people to -- customers to still come and get  
5 a take-home package, fill it out, they'll  
6 get a call, do intake over the phone and  
7 just bring back whatever we need. And then  
8 we call them back when they have to come in  
9 and sign for their vouchers, their purchase  
10 orders, for anything they we're paying for  
11 them. And it's a lot easier.

12 We don't have more than staff in the  
13 building still, and we are -- you know,  
14 still have these guards up everywhere  
15 downstairs, and we're still cleaning daily,  
16 our maintenance department. So we're pretty  
17 good.

18 We're back at the NPC Monday through  
19 Friday, and we are recouping some of our  
20 money as we can, like -- was that two weeks  
21 or a week ago, Ms. Scott or Ms. Hunter? We  
22 had like a repass almost every day of the  
23 week. We're still holding it at 80 people  
24 per event. And we now also have -- what's  
25 also included in our reimbursements, if you

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1 noticed downstairs, we have new metal  
2 detectors, but they also take temperatures.  
3 So everyone that walks in, walks through,  
4 and you probably heard it say your  
5 temperature is normal. Otherwise, you  
6 wouldn't have made it up to here. So I  
7 think we have had to turn a few people away.  
8 And I think that is the end of my report.

9 Is that everything, Ms. Smith?

10 MR. SMITH: Yes.

11 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Are there any  
12 questions, comments, concerns?

13 Thank you.

14 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Thank you.

15 Attorney Monroe?

16 MS. MONROE: Madam Trustee, I will say  
17 that the City did receive their  
18 reimbursement from the State for their PPE  
19 request so --

20 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Do you know how much  
21 it was?

22 MS. MONROE: I think we got \$100,000.

23 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Oh, okay.

24 MS. MONROE: And they're asking the  
25 various departments to let them know exactly

1           what they asked for so that they can put it  
2           back into the budget.

3           TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Good. Okay. Gives  
4           us hope -- encouraging, yes. Sorry.

5           CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Board comments?  
6           Ms. Holmes, do you have any comments?

7           MS. HOLMES: No, not today.

8           CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Mr. Piggee?

9           MR. PIGGEE: Well, I'm glad that the  
10          Trustee has got the Township building up to  
11          par and doing what you're supposed to do  
12          because everywhere you go the people are  
13          sticking their gun up to your head and  
14          taking your temperature and that type of  
15          thing.

16          TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Oh, okay.

17          (LAUGHTER.)

18          MR. PIGGEE: Everywhere you go, so I'm  
19          glad you're keeping that up to date now.

20          TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Thank you. And we've  
21          got thermometers down here. We don't got  
22          guns.

23          CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Is that it?

24          MR. PIGGEE: Yeah.

25          CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Are you done?

1 MR. PIGGEE: I'm positive.

2 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: I also would like  
3 to thank council president, Mr. Godwin,  
4 Ms. Barnes Caldwell in the fifth district  
5 and Mr. Ron Brewer at large for attending  
6 our meeting. We're not usually blessed with  
7 such royalty. Thank you for coming out.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good to be here.

9 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: I just want to  
10 acknowledge the great job that I believe --  
11 that we believe that our Trustee has done,  
12 especially during the pandemic. I think  
13 that the worst is yet to come, but we still  
14 need to be wise and make sure we're  
15 operating at six feet and also wearing  
16 our mask. I know what others have said,  
17 that it's a hoax, but there has been many  
18 deaths and many prominent deaths to say  
19 otherwise.

20 So me, personally -- I don't speak for  
21 the board, but I pray that God continues to  
22 bless everyone in the city and in this  
23 community with a blood hedge of protection  
24 as we are spiritually right now in the Feast  
25 of Trumpets. And then in about nine days we

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1 will have the Day of Atonement and then  
2 followed by the Feast of Tabernacles,  
3 which talks about God's coming and also  
4 repenting.

5 So I believe that as we come together as  
6 a community and follow the commandments of  
7 God, he will protect us because the word of  
8 God says no weapon formed against us and  
9 knowingly shall prosper and all things work  
10 together for the good to them who love God,  
11 to them who are called according to his  
12 purpose.

13 And I believe everyone in this room who  
14 fights for justice, fights for our people,  
15 we are called according to his purpose.  
16 So don't be afraid because there's a  
17 blood hedge of protection around Gary,  
18 Indiana, Northwest Indiana and its  
19 residents.

20 And with that being said, the Chair  
21 makes a motion for adjournment. Is there a  
22 second?

23 MS. HOLMES: I second.

24 CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: All in favor  
25 signify by saying aye?

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BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN WASHINGTON: Opposed, nay. The ayes have it. You all have a blessed and wonderful evening. Thank you.

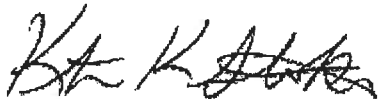

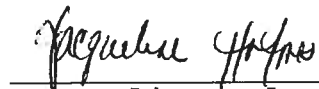
