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1	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: At this time
2	we're going to call the meeting to order. May
3	we all stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.
4	(Pledge of Allegiance recited.)
5	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Now we're going
6	to have roll call for attendance.
7	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Mr. Piggee?
8	MR. PIGGEE: Present.
9	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Ms. Holmes?
10	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Present. All
11	right. We have two Board members present. So
12	we have a quorum.
13	Okay. Let's move along with the
14	approval of the minutes from the February 2022
15	meeting. Are there additions that we need to
16	add to the minutes?
17	(No immediate response.)
18	MS. CUNNINGHAM: You need a motion.
19	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: So we're going
20	to move for a motion for approval of the
21	minutes.
22	MR. PIGGEE: So moved. I'm sorry.
23	Second.
24	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Roll call,
25	Ms. Cunningham.

1	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Mr. Piggee?
2	MR. PIGGEE: Yes.
3	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Ms. Holmes?
4	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Yes.
5	ATTORNEY MONROE: For the record, we
6	need her to say it's approved.
7	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Chair made a
8	motion for the approval of the minutes for the
9	last meeting. So approved.
10	So we're going to go to our
11	resolutions. The first one is 2022-06, and
12	that would be
13	MS. CUNNINGHAM: The temporary loan
14	extension.
15	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: And I will defer
16	to Mr. Dalton for the explanation.
17	MR. DALTON: Well, thank you.
18	Resolution 2022-06 is our annual extension of
19	the loan that is existing between the Rainy
20	Day Fund and the General Fund. We've done
21	this every year for the last eight years.
22	What this does is, it says we don't know if
23	we'll pay it back on December 31st, but we
24	know we'll pay it back in January, as to when
25	we get our tax draw from the County. We have

1 plenty of money. 2 To remind everyone, the only reason we take a loan from the Rainy Day Fund is for 3 4 cash management, so that we don't have to borrow from the bank. We don't pay any 5 interest. We're borrowing from our own 6 7 savings account, but this is a required 8 document. When we borrow from ourselves, we 9 must either pay it back by the end of the year or pass this resolution until we can pay it 10 11 back in January. I would ask for your 12 approval. 13 MR. PIGGEE: I have a question on 14 that. 15 MR. DALTON: Yes, sir. MR. PIGGEE: What is our balance by 16 17 the first of the year if we don't pay it back 18 in December? 19 MR. DALTON: There's a \$500,000 loan 20 outstanding right now, Mr. Piggee, that will be paid back in January from the Rainy Day 21 Fund, since that's the balance of the 22 23 outstanding loan. 24 MR. PIGGEE: Okay. So that's what I 25 need to know. I like to keep up with that

1	type of information.
2	MR. DALTON: Understood.
3	MR. PIGGEE: We do need a motion on
4	that? I move that we accept the report.
5	(Discussion held off the record.)
6	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Okay. The Chair
7	makes a motion for the approval.
8	MR. PIGGEE: So moved. I second it.
9	I forgot there's only two of us.
10	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Mr. Piggee?
11	MR. PIGGEE: Yes.
12	MS. CUNNINGHAM: And Ms. Holmes?
13	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Yes.
14	Next is Resolution 2022-07, Budget
15	Resolution, State Budget Form 4. Mr. Dalton?
16	MR. DALTON: Shall I?
17	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Yes, please.
18	MR. DALTON: Thank you, Trustee.
19	One of the most important actions of any
20	township board is the approval of the annual
21	budget. The annual budget is prepared by the
22	Trustee and presented to you as a board and to
23	you as a public in the fall. We are looking
24	at the 2023 budget now. So we're planning
25	ahead. Tonight is only the public hearing.

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So there's no reason to host a vote, Madam
Chair, as much as open up for questions from
the public and comments from the public. I'd
like to give you a summary, if that's okay,
just because it seems awkward for anybody to
comment on something that they haven't
actually heard what's in it. So if that's
okay with everyone, and I'll make it brief.

Tonight is the public hearing. adoption hearing would be on October 17th at this same time. The Rainy Day Fund is budgeted or proposed to be budgeted at \$1.5 million. We typically budget quite a bit in this fund and we typically spend a lot less than we budget. We use this fund for our temporary loans and we use this fund for emergency capital expenses. For example, this building has had its share of issues with the elevators and heating and cooling systems. This is a fund that can be used for those types of capital expenditures.

The General Fund, which is for all Township activities, the budget that is proposed is \$1.8 million for 2023. That happens to be \$200,000 less than the 2022

budget. An improvement, if you will, because we'll be anticipating spending less than our 2022 budget. For Township Assistance Administration, again, a very small decline. The 2022 budget that we're living in right now is \$1.75 million. We're asking for a budget -- the Trustee is asking for a budget of \$1.7 million, \$50,000 less for 2023. And then for Township Assistance Benefits, a fourth of the budget that you'd be looking at, is the exact same between 2023 and 2022, at \$1.8 million.

I want to compliment the Township staff, the Trustee and her team involved in Township assistance. We have endured a couple years of rocky days; COVID, of course, being a global pandemic that none us were anticipating. This team found grant money and they found donations and they found assistance from the City and we used our Township assistance wisely. And this team came out of 2020 and 2021 with, one, a better financial position than they entered the global pandemic, and I believe -- and maybe I'm subjective when I say this, having done a very

1	terrific job in taking care of those less
2	advantaged and those needing assistance in
3	this community.
4	I just wanted to compliment them,
5	and I'll step down. You do not need to take
6	action this evening. But if you could, Madam
7	Chair, open it for public comments or public
8	questions, this would be the moment for that.
9	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Okay. Thank you
10	very much. Are there any questions from the
11	audience, or comments?
12	(No immediate response.)
13	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Mr. Piggee?
14	MR. PIGGEE: Not at this time.
15	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Thank you.
16	ATTORNEY MONROE: So we're going to
17	save this for
18	ATTORNEY WILLIAMS: Yes, we're not
19	taking any action.
20	ATTORNEY MONROE: Okay.
21	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: The next
22	resolution is 2022-08, Salary Resolution for
23	2023.
24	MR. DALTON: Trustee?
25	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Yes.
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1	MR. DALTON: I feel like I'm
2	monopolizing here. So cut me off whenever you
3	want me to shut up.
4	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: No, no.
5	MR. DALTON: Annually, we bring to
6	you the salaries as proposed for the following
7	year, the ones that go along with the budget,
8	and those are incapsulated here in this
9	Resolution 2022-08. There are a couple minor
10	modifications. I'm sure Sherita could explain
11	those to you if you have questions. But, for
12	the most part, we have continued for the last
13	few years to manage this Township with a few
14	less people than we started with and paying
15	those lesser people a little bit more than
16	they were at a few years back, trying to pay
17	to keep grade people here on the staff so we
18	don't lose them in this very tight labor
19	market. 2022-08, we would ask for your
20	approval this evening and you could vote on
21	this for 2023's salaries.
22	MR. PIGGEE: Tell me this, how many
23	people have we lost this year?
24	MR. DALTON: Sherita, can you answer
25	that?

1	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: Anyone that we've
2	lost, that's been as a result of them moving
3	on to other opportunities. So we have not had
4	to terminate anyone. Individuals have retired
5	or individuals have moved on to other things.
6	So there have been no terminations, and that
7	number
8	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: I don't think
9	anybody this year.
10	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: No.
11	MR. PIGGEE: But can you tell me
12	what our staff is looking at in terms of
13	numbers?
14	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: What our staff is
15	looking at? 46 is the number.
16	MR. PIGGEE: For staff.
17	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: Correct.
18	MR. PIGGEE: And how many was there
19	before the 46?
20	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: I believe that
21	number was around 50.
22	MR. PIGGEE: Okay.
23	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: It was 79 when we
24	first got here. In '15, it was 79.
25	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: And each year, up

1	until the recent two to three years, we have
2	had to make hard decisions and lose certain
3	departments, merge others together, but that
4	has not been the case here. We have a very
5	solid staff and team. The work is able to
6	continue to be done. Even when we had 70 some
7	people, the 46 individuals that are here now
8	are handling that, and then some.
9	MR. PIGGEE: Okay.
10	CHIEF DEP. SMITH: It's a phenomenal
11	staff.
12	MR. PIGGEE: It sounds good. Sounds
13	good.
14	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Is there anybody
15	from the public that would like to comment?
16	(No immediate response.)
17	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: The next one is
18	Resolution 2022-09.
19	MS. CUNNINGHAM: A motion.
20	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Are you going to
21	vote on the salary tonight?
22	MR. DALTON: It is our request.
23	ATTORNEY MONROE: So we need to move
24	for acceptance of that one.
25	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: So then the next

1	meeting all we have is just the budget to vote
2	on.
3	MR. DALTON: Yes.
4	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Okay.
5	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: So the Chair
6	would like to motion for Resolution 2022-08,
7	Salary Resolution for 2023.
8	MR. PIGGEE: I second it.
9	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Okay. Seconded by
10	Mr. Piggee. And roll call. Mr. Piggee?
11	MR. PIGGEE: Yes.
12	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Ms. Holmes?
13	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Yes.
14	MR. DALTON: Thank you.
15	MS. CUNNINGHAM: Moving on to
16	Resolution 2022-09.
17	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: That will be
18	Mr. Dalton?
19	MR. DALTON: It will. And it may
20	seem odd, if you put these two resolutions
21	next to each other, it seems like we're
22	committing a redundancy and so I'll explain
23	why. The Trustee feels that the staff has
24	done a pretty terrific job and she would like
25	to move to make the raises and the adjustments

1 to salaries that would take place normally on January 1st of 2023, she would like to do so 2 3 now. So this resolution is an amendment to the resolution that we're currently living in 4 5 for 2022, to give those raises now to our current employees instead of having them wait 6 7 until January 1st of 2023. MR. PIGGEE: You're talking as of 8 9 now. 10 MR. DALTON: As of today. 11 MR. PIGGEE: Okay. Trustee, does 12 she have an idea of what types of raises she 13 wants to give the people? 14 MR. DALTON: Sherita, could you 15 comment on the raises that are involved in 16 this specific request? 17 CHIEF DEP. SMITH: The Trustee has 18 gone through all the positions of the Township 19 and she has indicated for each position, based 20 on the ranges that have been established for 21 those positions, that individuals will receive 22 an increase. And so what you're voting on is 23 just that it can take place, as Mr. Dalton 24 said, right away, as opposed to having to wait

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until -- you've already approved the budget

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for 2023, but she would like to move for it 1 2 this year so they can enjoy some of that this year because of, again, the work that has been 3 4 done. 5 Because these are individuals that have gone above and beyond with all of the 6 7 things that Mr. Dalton mentioned, the pandemic and everything that's gone along with it. 8 9 one has ever been denied service, if they met 10 the eligibility requirements that have been set. So we have helped and continue to help 11 under the leadership of our Trustee, and she 12 13 would just like to share that with her 14 remarkable staff. 15 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: The ranges -- I think what you're asking, Mr. Piggee, the 16 17 ranges have been between 1,000 to 4,000, if 18 that's what you're asking, as much as people 19 have gone up. 20 MR. PIGGEE: Exactly. 21 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Staff is all

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public comment. Maybe one of them can tell

I'm not sure why they won't say

anything, like thank you, but they're here to

make sure it's done tonight. So back to

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here.

you exactly how grateful they are of these 1 2 changes or this amendment to the budget to bring it forth today rather than wait. 3 is September. So rather than wait until 4 5 January, we just begin it now. 6 MR. PIGGEE: And I'm sure the public would like to know some of these ranges and 7 8 that type of thing. Okay? 9 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: If they ask me. MR. PIGGEE: Yeah, that's the reason 10 11 I made that statement, because you got a lot of public people here today. 12 TRUSTEE ROBINSON: 13 That's fine. 14 MR. PIGGEE: Okay. 15 CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Any comments 16 from the public? 17 MR. BUGGS: Yes. Thank you, 18 Chairwoman Holmes and Board and Madam Trustee. I think that it's an excellent idea, because 19 20 maybe a lot of people don't know. When we had COVID and everything shut down, except the 21 22 Trustee's office, those people that were 23 receiving services still received services. 24 And with the hike in the gas prices and 25 NIPSCO, and everything that's going up, this

:	is an excellent idea, instead of waiting until
. 2	next year to do it now. So, thank you again.
3	TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Thank you,
4	Mr. Buggs.
5	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: There's a hand
6	in the back.
7	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm a current
8	employee. I was not aware of the raise, and I
9	would be so gracious if the Board would
10	approve. Very kindly, thank you.
11	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I second
12	that.
13	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I second it
-14	too.
15	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I second it
16	too.
17	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Sounds like
18	you're making a motion to accept. Thank you.
19	Mr. Piggee?
20	MR. PIGGEE: Second.
21	MS. CUNNINGHAM: And roll call.
22	Mr. Piggee?
23	MR. PIGGEE: Yes.
24	MS. CUNNINGHAM: And Ms. Holmes?
25	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Yes.
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1	(Applauding.)
2	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Are there any
3	public comments? We're at the end.
4	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'd like to
5	make a comment.
6	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Go ahead.
7	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I work at
8	MPC, the other building, not exactly this one,
9	but where we have all the events. I just
10	wanted to say, I want to thank Trustee for
11	keeping us, you know, fully staffed over there
12	to provide for the people who need services,
13	like the warming center, the cooling center,
14	and I'm just glad to be a part of it, and I do
15	appreciate the raise, if it does get approved.
16	CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Thank you very
17	much. We appreciate that.
18	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I would just
19	like to piggyback on what (Inaudible.) just
20	said. We have been able to continue to work
21	through the leadership of the Trustee, putting
22	PPE and all the things to protect people
23	coming in, as well as the people going out.
24	She went so far as to also include provisions
25	to make sure that we can check on ourselves to

make sure that we're safe.

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So I don't know why she hasn't talked more about it, but she's done more than any person that I've heard of leading any type of a workforce, and she's also set an example for other people trying to do the same by bringing on people to test and make sure that the staff is safe. So to that I'd just like to say thank you, Trustee.

TRUSTEE ROBINSON: Thank you.

CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Very good.

Anybody else want to say anything?

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hi. My name is Ronny. I've worked in both buildings. Currently, I'm at the MPC. I just want to say that I really appreciate working here, and especially the Trustee. I've known her a long time, but I had never worked with her before, but it's been a great experience working for you and with you and with this community, and she makes it a point to let me know that it's okay for me to be here until -- to follow my dreams and finish school. I am a student. And the environment here is really positive. So that's what I appreciate most of all.

Coming from other jobs where there might be a little more tension and the team doesn't work as well together, this team is really cohesive and we get a lot of things done, and I really appreciate that.

(Applauding.)

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CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: Trustee?

TRUSTEE ROBINSON: The raises got You all can go back to normal now. paid. I just want to say it has truly been, as I always say, a labor of love. This is what I love doing. This is what I want to do forever, or as long as I can, with grace and dignity. The staff is excellent. I did not do this alone. They were right there with me when I said that we would not close. We would do everything to protect ourselves. We were sure that everyone is well to go home to their families and come back to work. So it's just been great, and not without the help of the Board, the entire Board. I appreciate you guys understanding and working with me.

And I am happy to see our near future Board member, Mr. Michael Protho, in the audience tonight. He is the nominee, and

1 I think as of Wednesday he will be able to sit 2 here with you guys, and especially on your 3 next meeting, October 17th, he'll be up there 4 ready to take a vote. So I'm glad that he was 5 able tonight to see what he's walking into. pretty nice group of people in helping the 6 7 community. We work on the council together. 8 So we understand each other. We know what it is to be of service, not just an elected 9 10 official, but actually a public servant. 11 am happy that he did come or he is able to 12 come on early and join us. 13 (Applauding.) CHAIRWOMAN HOLMES: 14 Mr. Piggee? 15 MR. PIGGEE: Let me say this. really admire the staff here at the Township, 16 17 especially the boss lady, and the other boss 18 lady, Ms. Smith. 19 CHIEF DEP. SMITH: Baby Boss. 20 MR. PIGGEE: The thing about it is, 21 when we make a suggestion, they take it 22 serious. They take it serious. I came in one time and I didn't see that many male staff

hire male staff members. And I just think

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
1	it's a fantastic organization that's here, and
